Mind-Body Perspective of Trauma - Three Days

Dr. Everett is Director of the HU Integrative Healthcare Track. She has 35 years experience as an Integrative Practitioner incorporating multiple Body/Mind techniques from western medicine and native cultures. Her hospital nursing experience included critical care, renal transplant, and emergency medicine. She is the Founder and Director of Trauma First Aide Associates. This residency workshop presents an Integrative Perspective of Trauma. This includes secondary trauma within the caregiver communities themselves! Developed as a short-term trauma intervention, **Trauma First Aide™ (TFA)** teaches skills to quickly reduce symptoms of acute traumatic stress and to stabilize the nervous system in high arousal and urgent situations. Participants will engage in lively discussions, learn to recognize

their own response patterns, learn simple skills to use self care strategies and to help others and most important - lots of time and opportunity to practice. Topics covered include: background research; the nervous system's role in trauma; differences between cognitive and somatic approaches; role of memory in trauma; effects of trauma beyond mental health; case studies; skills practice; and scenario-based applications. **Public Fee: \$ 225.00 plus workbook.**

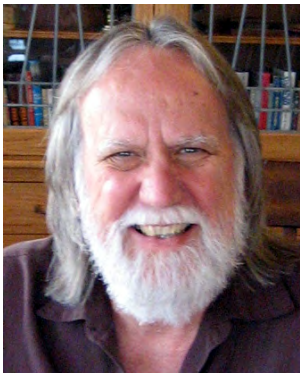


Mysticism – Ancient to New Thought - Two-Days

Mysticism scholars Teri and Benjamin Martin join Bob Nunley, HU's Faculty Dean, to present this dynamic residency workshop. For 30 years the Martins have been students of Sacred Humanism. Teri is an ordained minister of the Christuman Church and is Rectrix and President of the Christuman Humanities Institute. Benjamin is a poet and author of many spiritual treatises centered on that which is universal and true in all spiritually based philosophies. Lectures and dialog move participants through a survey of Mystics and Mysticism across the major religious traditions of Hinduism, Buddhism, Zoroastrianism, Christianity, Judaism, and Islam. We will explore the language and experience of “beloving” (as opposed as it has been expressed by mystics from the Ancient Past to the Post-Modern Era.
